

## Identity verification in a digital world

As technology advances, traditional methods of identity verification such as passports and IDs may no longer be necessary. The author recounts their own experience of trying to renew an expired passport in Israel and suggests that a digital system, such as a fingerprint scan that brings up all relevant personal data, could be a more effective and efficient means of identification. However, concerns over cybersecurity and the need for data management solutions must also be considered. Digital authentication can also be applied to document verification and knowledge management, with the use of knowledge graphs already being utilized in the field.


## Ascending the golden bridge: an implementation tool for changes and new KM technologies

The bridge metaphor is a useful tool to describe the transition from one stage to another and to reflect on emotional associations during change. The Unifying Bridge model, developed by Elon Walhead, offers six resources to cope with change: body, mind, emotion, belief system, society, and imagination. When applying this model to Knowledge Management solutions, organizations can pre-assess and design an implementation plan by considering all six resources. By utilizing the six components, organizations can successfully manage change while paying attention to workers' abilities, expectations, and emotional needs, thus creating a positive and exciting work environment.
